PFC Ralph H. Johnson's Birthday

Pfc. Johnson was born in Charleston on January 11, 1949. In 1967 he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps and deployed to Vietnam 1968 in during Operation Rock. During an ambush, a grenade was hurled into Johnson's two-man fighting hole. Johnson selflessly threw his body onto the grenade and was killed saving his fellow Marines. For this heroic act, President Richard Nixon posthumously awarded Johnson with the Congressional Medal of Honor.

On September 5, 1991, the Charleston VA Medical Center was formally renamed the Ralph H. Johnson VA Medical Center in honor of one of Charleston's most heroic natives. When the hospital was renamed to the Ralph H. Johnson VA, Pfc. Johnson became the first African American soldier to have a VA named after him. The Health Care System and the Fisher House celebrated Pfc. Johnson's life and sacrifice on January 11, 2023 – what would have been his 74th birthday.
